The Assistant Floating Teacher will work with the other teachers to provide a warm, nurturing, prepared Montessori environment to students (aged 3-6) when regular classroom staff are unavailable. When not assigned to a classroom, the Assistant Floating Teacher will support administrative activities. This individual is flexible and adaptable to a variety of environments and different tasks, and has a love for children of all ages.
